DDBS AND CIVITAS

The mission of the Derby Diversity & Business Summit (DDBS) is to drive innovative strategies to attract diverse consumers while promoting the intersection of best in class diverse business leaders within the Executive Workforce and Global Supply Chain. Each year DDBS provides funding to a chosen non-profit organization that provides year-round programming and education to diverse business leaders.

The seed to create CIVITAS was planted during DDBS 2018 after many of the attendees had the opportunity to learn and engage with the leadership from the National Gay & Lesbian Chamber of Commerce (NGLCC) who attended the Summit as guest speakers. The momentum swelled out of the desire of many stakeholders from Louisville, Cincinnati, Lexington, and beyond to create a LGBT business chamber focused on supporting and cultivating a thriving LGBTBE business community.

CIVITAS officially launched at DDBS 2019 as the official regional chamber of commerce for the Ohio River Valley for LGBTBE and ally businesses, and has been established as NGLCC's national affiliate network, which represents a membership of over 1000 LGBTBEs. NGLCC worldwide is comprised of 60 affiliate chambers spanning the globe. CIVITAS received a \$5000 grant from DDBS to launch.

The main objectives of CIVITAS include:

- To grow the number of LGBT-certified businesses in the Ohio River Valley (Kentucky, Southern Ohio, Southern Indiana).
- Support corporations in creating inclusive workplaces, expanding supply chain investments and becoming effective advocates for the LGBT community.
- Expand investment in and support for LGBT entrepreneurs.

Since the Derby Diversity & Business Summit 2019, CIVITAS has taken several strides towards supporting their goals and objectives which include:

- Expanding recruitment of members and certified LGBT BE's in the Cincinnati area
- Initiated the project "We C You" to raise awareness of LGBT businesses and LGBT people in the workforce.
- Partnered with the Louisville City Council to pass an ordinance to include LGBT Business Enterprises in their diverse supplier base.

The financial support and connections derived from the Derby Diversity & Business Summit to cultivate projects such as CIVITAS are just two of the many ways DDBS can help positively impact diversity initiatives around the globe.

DDBS AND NAWBO

NAWBO was the 2018 DDBS Grant recipient in 2018 the Derby Diversity & Business Summit donated a \$5,000 grant to NAWBO, a non-profit organization that supports, provides resources, aids opportunities and forms partnerships among the woman-owned business community. The National Association of Women Business Owners (NAWBO), Louisville Chapter, is THE essential community for all women business owners with a diverse group of members supporting, encouraging, teaching and sharing with each other. No matter what stage a business may be in -- from brand-new start-ups to longstanding, publicly held companies -- their programs and initiatives support the woman entrepreneur.

The GROW program helps NAWBO members to grow their business to higher levels of success. NAWBO Grow was formed as an answer to a call for action to help women who often struggle at each stage in their businesses. Whether the business is "new-born," "middle-aged," or "silver," there are different challenges to be addressed and NAWBO Grow addresses each of these stages and gives women the resources necessary to progress in a positive direction from one stage to the next. Derby Diversity & Business Summit was proud to partner with such an organization as we strive to support diverse business owners.




